So! The Vancouver Fraser Port Authority is federally mandated to enable Canada's trade through the Port of Vancouver, while ensuring safety, environmental protection and consideration for communities.

To take that even further, we've set a vision for the Port of Vancouver to be the world's most sustainable port.

We take a three-pillar approach to sustainability, so we're working to make this port globally successful at delivering economic prosperity through trade; maintaining a healthy environment; and enabling thriving communities.
