ROBERTS BANK RAIL CORRIDOR

- The RBRC program is a comprehensive package of road and rail improvement projects. It is designed to improve the safety and efficiency of the road and rail network, and enhance quality of life for residents of communities through which rail traffic travels to and from the Deltaport terminal at Roberts Bank in Delta.
- Total funding for the nine Roberts Bank Rail Corridor projects is about \$307 million including:
- The official opening of the Mufford Crescent overpass marked the completion of all nine RBRC infrastructure improvement projects in the Lower Mainland.
- The newly-opened Mufford Crescent overpass is named in honour of one of the Township of Langley's longstanding pioneer families.

DELTA TERMINAL, ROAD AND RAIL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

- The sixth and final phase of the overpass construction began July 2014 and will run until October 2014. This phase will include the following work:
 - Construction of the North, South East and South West Approach Ramps
 - Paving and line painting of the bridge deck, approach ramps and inbound container terminal lane
 - Construction of the U-Turn Route

Proposed McDonald and Point Grey Tidal Marsh Projects

Proposed Westham Island Canoe Pass Tidal Marsh Project

Glenrose Tidal Marsh Project:

- Habitat enhancement work is now complete and planting of marsh vegetation is currently underway at the three sites (Glenrose Downstream, Glenrose Cannery and Gunderson Mudflat). Planting is expected to be complete by the end of September.
