Steelmaking Coal Improvement Project



Air Quality Permit Amendment



- Neptune's steelmaking coal improvement project includes:
 1. Replacement shiploader
 2. Second coal dumper
 3. New conveyor
- The railcar dumper will have new dust collection equipment. This equipment, used to remove dust from within the dumper shed, is considered an air quality emission source.
- As a result, Neptune is applying to Metro Vancouver to amend our existing air permit.

Three Important Study Results

- Over the past six months, independent environmental and health science experts conducted a comprehensive assessment of the terminal's current and future operations to identify potential impacts.
- Study conclusions:
 1. Neptune will continue to operate within the allowable levels of the existing permit
 2. Local air quality will remain the same
 3. The project will not have an impact on health risks

Sharing Information & Getting Feedback

- Consistent with how we have operated for 45 years, we will continue to be open and transparent about our terminal activities with the local community
- We have a number of public engagement activities planned. The first step will be to ensure the North Shore community is aware of our application. We'll then be working with Metro Vancouver to solicit feedback and comments from the community about our application.
