PROJECT SCOPE - PHASE I JANUARY-MARCH 2016

- Relocation of BC Hydro poles
- Closure of eastbound bypass lane (curb installation marked with the red lines)





PROJECT SCOPE - PHASE II (CONT'D) <u>APRIL 2016 - SEPTEMBER 2016</u>



- Realign and shift Commissioner St to the north (south curb line to be moved up to the red line)
- Provides room for one east-bound and two west-bound future traffic lanes.



PROJECT SCOPE - PHASE II (CONT'D) APRIL 2016 - SEPTEMBER 2016

 Replacing and extending existing ocean-facing retaining wall (4.5m high)





PROJECT SCOPE - PHASE II <u>APRIL 2016 - SEPTEMBER 2016</u>

Construction of a new retaining wall (1m high) on the outside curve of New Brighton Rd at the Commissioner St – New Brighton Rd intersection.





PROJECT SCOPE - PHASE III (CONT'D) JANUARY 2017 - SEPTEMBER 2017




- Demolition of existing grain elevator at Columbia Containers following construction of their new facility.
- Extension of BC Hydro lines (from A to B)
- Construction of new road alignment through the footprint of the Columbia Containers grain elevator.



PROJECT SCOPE - PHASE III JANUARY 2017 - SEPTEMBER 2017

 Realignment of GVRD sanitary sewer and water main into the footprint of the new road alignment.





PROJECT OUTCOMES

- Improve the overall flow of traffic on Commissioner St
- Reduce possible congestion at McGill VACS gates. May result in reduced truck noise.
- Improve the pavement surface, which may reduce truck trailer noise.
- Removal of existing Columbia Containers grain elevator.



NEXT STEPS

- Will undergo Category C (TBD) review under PMV's Project and Environmental Review (PER) process.
- Under East Vancouver Port Lands Area Plan -Conditionally Approvable (Yellow) Use
- Public consultation required for PER and EVPL Area Plan, with in-person meeting opportunity, notifications, online outreach (dates to be determined)
