Activities are anticipated to include daytime work only.</p> <p><u>Purpose:</u> To assess potential archaeological values and collect biophysical information at the proposed Maplewood Marine Restoration Project site.</p> <p><u>Field work area:</u> The marine and upland areas of the proposed Maplewood Marine Restoration Project site, located on the north shore of Burrard Inlet, approximately two kilometres east of the Ironworkers Memorial Bridge, in North Vancouver, B.C.</p> <p><u>Methods:</u> Archaeologists and members of the Tsleil-Waututh Nation will be conducting a site visit on the mudflats, south of the Maplewood Flats Conservation Area, to determine potential archaeological values at the proposed project site. A biologist will also be on site to concurrently collect biophysical information.</p>
