Deltaport Truck Staging Facility

Construction Update

- As part of construction for the project, ground remediation below the HWY 17A overpass took place during December 2019, and final asphalt pavement to take place towards the end of March 2020.

Roberts Bank Terminal 2

- The port authority is conducting market research as part of preparing for the procurement process for the Roberts Bank Terminal 2 Project. By conducting market research, the port authority is able to hear from a cross-section of concessionaire leads, financiers, operators and infrastructure developers about their thoughts on possible procurement options for construction and operation of the proposed project. Information received during market research will help inform selection of a procurement delivery model.
- Following selection of a procurement delivery model, the port authority anticipates conducting a market sounding process which is anticipated to begin in spring 2020.

ECHO Program

- Planning is underway for 2020 projects to help reduce the effects of marine shipping on at-risk whales. For more information, see www.portvancouver.com/echo

Habitat Enhancement Program (HEP)

Westham Island/Canoe Pass Tidal Marsh Project

- This project is located in provincial jurisdiction, the port submitted a land tenure application to the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development (MFLNROD) in 2014. VFPA is currently working with MFLROD to finalize the terms of a lease.

Land Use Plan update engagement process

- Phase 1 engagement ran from November 18 to December 9, 2019. This included an interactive mapping tool of proposed designation updates, background information and a survey.
- Phase 2: Engagement on the draft plan is expected to take place in Spring 2020.

Impacts to vessel movements in the port due to the coronavirus

On January 28, 2020, health officials [announced](#) the first confirmed case of novel coronavirus in British Columbia. To date, there have been no impacts to waterfront operations.

Transport Canada issued a Marine Security Notification on January 30 providing information and guidance to the Canadian marine industry on protocols to safeguard the health and safety of those working in Canada's marine sector.

At this time, we have not had any reported impacts to vessel traffic in the Port of Vancouver.

Planning for a future overpass along Holdom Avenue over the rail line in Burnaby is officially underway, as the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority signed a memorandum of understanding with the City of Burnaby to guide the planning, design, and construction of a proposed Holdom overpass and closure of Douglas Road to vehicles at the rail crossing. This is the first of many steps, and the port authority, in partnership with the City of Burnaby, will undertake public engagement and Indigenous consultation for the project starting in spring 2020.
