District of West Vancouver			

- Shared community concerns of noise and light from the West Vancouver anchorages
- The West Vancouver Community Cultural Festival took place June 2 to 3, 2023.
- Provided an update on the Ambleside Park revitalization project

District of North Vancouver

- Sema7maka (semma makka) (or Snowbird) and Ch'chi'yuy (Two Sisters) canoe families had their combined awakening ceremonies at Ambleside on April 29th. It was a great day and both families were grateful to those who attended to witness their ceremony.
- There was an Outdoor Safety and Emergency Preparedness Open House at Argyle Secondary School on May 13th. This is always a fun and informative event, and well attended.
- The CapU canoe had an awakening ceremony on May 30th. Skw'chys (skwah chice), is a hunting canoe carved by Squamish Nation master carver, Ses Syem (Ray Natruro).
- North Shore Community Foundation had their annual golf tournament on Friday, June 2nd at the Seymour Golf and Country Club - this year's recipients were the Sema7maka and Chi'chi'yuy canoe families as well as the Orange Shirt Society.

Indigenous:

- Squamish Nation
 - Provided an update on the comprehensive land use strategy for parcels of land in North shore which includes Capilano reserve and Seymour reserve
 - Squamish Nation is marking 100 years since 16 of its villages amalgamated to form one political body. The 100th Amalgamation Day Festival on July 23 will be an all-ages event held at Ambleside Park with family activities, food trucks, artisan market, traditional performances and more.

Municipal:

- City of North Vancouver
 - Council approved a land dedication, working with CP, in support of the Marine-Main R2 RapidBus Upgrades. The City is working with TransLink, which will improve bus speed and reliability along East 3rd Street and Cotton Road. Construction is expected to start this summer.
 - The Shipyards District programming is in full swing. The Shipyards
 Night Market occurs every Friday night from May 12 to September 15.

 There will also be events throughout the summer, including the Beer by the Pier fundraiser and Vancouver International Mountain Film Festival.
 - Visit The Shipyards District website to learn more.
 - The <u>Let's Talk Engagement Expo</u> will be held on June 17 where attendees can meet City staff, learn more about projects, answer surveys, and provide feedback. There will be food trucks, games, prizes and music.

District of West Vancouver

- Completed three community engagements including <u>Engage with age</u> for seniors, the <u>Ambleside Local Area Plan</u>, and the <u>Urban Forest</u> <u>Management Plan</u>
- The Ambleside and Dundarave piers sustained significant damage due to a major storm that occurred, and the repair of both piers will begin in mid-June. They are anticipated to be complete early this fall.

- The District is planning an <u>outdoor fitness circuit</u> to install a new, public, outdoor fitness circuit in Ambleside Park
- Upcoming events include <u>Canada Day</u> on July 1, <u>National Indigenous</u> <u>Peoples Day</u> on June 21, <u>100th Amalgamation Day Festival</u> on July 23 and <u>Harmony Arts Festival</u>.

• District of North Vancouver

- Provided project updates for the North Vancouver-based hydrogen research and development firm HTEC, District council members voted to send the rezoning proposal to a public hearing.
- In partnership with Tsleil-Waututh, the District applied for a provincial grant for Cate's Park. The project is expected to be complete by March 2025.
- The <u>Livable Deep Cove</u> project will be complete this summer, and staff are working on returning patios to the pedestrian space that will be installed along the future one-way Lower Gallant Avenue.
- In May, the Wildfire Resiliency and Training Summit was held with a focus on community wildfire resiliency and wildland urban interface training.
- The <u>B.C. Hydrogen Ports Projects (BCH2)</u> was announced in early June 2023. The District of North Vancouver is working on updating their regulatory framework to make hydrogen fuel production on the North Shore possible. The District of North Vancouver is very supportive of this project, as it contributes to multiple objectives, including reducing GHS emissions and enabling a circular economy.
- The District's Economic development strategy is currently out for RFP. Public consultation is expected to begin Fall 2023, and the District is working with economic stakeholders on the waterfront and community.

Industry:

Seaspan

- The <u>proposed Seaspan Vancouver Drydock Water Lot Expansion</u> project in North Vancouver is currently under review.
- Will sponsor <u>Canada Day 2023</u> at the Shipyards, the <u>Coho Festival</u> on September 11, and the <u>Shipyards Festival</u> on September 17.
- Asks Squamish Nation and Tsleil-Waututh Nation artists to help create a design for two new EV shuttle buses.
- Permitting a land-based testing site on Pemberton campus which allows the Canadian Coast Guard and Navy to work on a replica bridge site
- Vancouver Drydock is planning to build a new building on site to replace the building that was deconstructed from the Pier a few years ago and that will replace the trailers currently on the site. Seaspan is also looking to build an office building on port property on the north west corner of the property as continued efforts for site beautification.
- BC Terminal Operators Association/ Richardson International:
 - Grain seeding is complete in Western Canada and Richardson is looking forward to the grain season
 - Richardson's <u>Railyard Expansion project</u> is well underway. The installation of new railyard should be complete in August.
 - Labour bargaining with ILWU and grain workers will be starting collective bargaining later this year.

Neptune Terminal

- Provided an update that the primary potash berth project is in the permitting phase and public consultation is expected to begin soon. Minor impacts to the community are expected.

	 Community site tour dates will be announced soon. Discussed air quality roles and encouraged community representatives to contact Lisa Dooling with air quality concerns related to Neptune. Neptune's Air Quality Monitoring Reports contain data from monitors located onsite at the terminal and offsite in the surrounding community.

Port update	 The port authority is looking at air quality regionally. For example, the Strathcona Area Air Quality Study launched in January 2023. The study aims to assess air quality conditions within the City of Vancouver's Strathcona neighbourhood, increase awareness and understanding of how air quality varies, and to identify opportunities for improvements. 	Place. • Provided update on Roberts Bank Terminal 2 project - On April 20, 2023, the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority welcomed the Government of Canada's decision to approve the Roberts Bank Terminal 2 Project following a rigorous environmental assessment, started in 2013.

North Shore community feedback	 The port authority received community feedback on a strange smell on the North Shore. Cargill confirmed that a grain bin overheated, and they worked around the clock to remove the bin. No further complaints were received. Received a concern about dust from a vessel near Alliance Grain Termainl on the South Shore. Our operations centre spoke with the superintendent who noted that the vessel was adding small amounts of cargo in strategic locations to ensure a safe sailing. During this time, dust suppression was inactive and the operation was completed shortly after. Also received a concern about operational noise and suspected water pollution at Seaspan Drydocks. The water seen being pumped overboard was ballast (sea water) and the tanks were required to be emptied for a planned inspection,
