
#### Delta is a port city



Every year, port activity in Delta supports:

- 4,800 jobs
- \$300 million in wages
- \$1.06 billion in economic activity
- \$7.78 million municipal tax paid by port tenants
- \$938,000 paid in lieu of taxes for vacant port land






# Highway 91 / Highway 17 interchange






