1.	 DP World Centerm Terminal Expansion Tour DP World provided a tour of the new Centerm Expansion, including an overview of how the new configuration and additional 15% footprint has increased terminal container capacity and operational efficiencies. 	1 hour
2.	 Welcome, Acknowledgments and Introductions Facilitator Pam Ryan welcomed the committee and recognized the First Nations territories on which the meeting was being held. Pam checked with committee members whether adjustments to the agenda as circulated were needed. Committee members declined adjustments. Meeting commenced at 7:06 pm. 	2 mins
3.	 Committee members engaged in a round-table update from their communities/organizations: <u>Vicki Scully, Grandview Woodland Area Council</u> – Vicki shared that the Grandview Woodland Area Council (GWAC) has recently elected new directors and they were currently working to identify and solidify new priorities. As a participant in the port authority's Port Forward initiative, Vicki also expressed interest in conducting a noise study, similar to the Strathcona Air Quality study. Informed the committee that monthly GWAC meetings will be starting again in September 2023. <u>Mike Lovecchio, CPKC</u> – Mike shared that CPKC was continuing their integration, which has gone smoothly to-date. Informed that the wildfires currently happening across Canada have not had significant operational impact on CPKC, but they continue to monitor the situation and reviewing their wildfire impact mitigation measures. Provided an update on the current South Shore expansion project and explained that the new track bed is in, additional work is ongoing, and all running on-time. <u>Andrea Kastanis, Strathcona Residents Association</u> – Celebrate Strathcona Air Quality study had a tent set up to engage the community throughout the event. Andrea informed the committee that traffic calming measures are currently in place in Strathcona, with no major feedback received from the City of Vancouver to-date. Informed the committee that consultation is currently ongoing with the Strathcona Business Improvement Association regarding a Downtown Eastide small business plan. Further updates to come. <u>David Hutchinson, Member-at-Large</u> – David reminded the committee of the June 17 Trinity St. Block Party. Mentioned that the city has implemented a new bike bath plan along New Brighton Park and shared concerns that the current map does not show a continuous path along Powell. David said he will continue to monitor this. <u>Luc Lamont-Caputo, Member-at-Large</u> – Luc mentioned he had checked with	25 mins

	 dispersed yet for CRAB Park. Naomi informed the committee that most of the work in CRAB Park had been conducted by the City. An update regarding the Centerm Expansion Community Investment Fund was then provided. Naomi informed the committee that additional community engagement was coming regarding this fund and that the funds had not been dispersed yet. <u>Jeff Otto, Member-at-Large</u> – Jeff asked about the potential impacts the ILWU strike could have on port operations. Port authority representatives informed him of resources within the BC Maritime Employers Association (BCMEA) that he could rely on to stay informed and up-to-date on the issue. <u>Angela Kirkham, DP World</u> – Angela informed the committee of the 	
	official Centerm Expansion Project opening celebration held in May 2023, which included a celebration of 100 years of DP World operations. The DP World President was in attendance at the celebration and Angela thanked DP World partners for their support.	
	Discussion: Port Siren Noise, Clarke St. & Hastings St. Traffic	
	 Vicki Scully asked to address the committee and port authority regarding siren noise stemming from port terminal operations. Vicki enquired as to whether additional measures could be taken to engage nearby communities in a noise study, similar to air quality studies. 	
	 Naomi provided a response from the port authority, informing the committee that the port authority's Community Feedback Line has received 28 enquiries regarding noise at Centerm and Vanterm within the past 2 years and that the port authority continues to work with terminal operators on noise mitigation measures, where possible. 	10 mins
4.	 Angela reminded the committee that additional infrastructure changes have occurred nearby, which could have an impact on how noise travels within the area now (e.g. Heatley overpass removal, which could previously have provided a sound barrier to noise movement). 	TOTILITS
	 Vicki asked the port authority to be more proactive in sharing with local communities on how to contact the port with noise complaints. 	
	 Pam reminded the committee that, as representatives, they should also be proactive in sharing port authority contact resources (specifically the Community Feedback Line) with their communities/organizations to contact the port with any issues/concerns.

5.	 Naomi provided an update on the port authority and reminded the committee about the upcoming Canada Together celebration happening on Canada Day, July 1, at Canada Place. Andrea asked about the recently released World Bank 2022 Global Container Port Index report results. Naomi informed the committee that the port authority was still looking into this, but that the committee would receive follow-up information regarding port authority research into the methodology and sample data used. 	10 mins
