

ANNUAL REPORT TO PARLIAMENT

ACCESS TO INFORMATION ACT

REPORTING PERIOD: APRIL 1, 2019 TO MARCH 31, 2020



Introduction

The role of the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority ("VFPA") is to responsibly facilitate Canada's trade through the Port of Vancouver, the country's largest port. Accountable to the Minister of Transport, we manage federal lands, water and assets along hundreds of kilometres of shoreline, bordering 16 municipalities and intersecting the asserted and established traditional territories and treaty lands of several Coast Salish Peoples. Guided by a vision for a sustainable port, we work for the benefit of all Canadians.

The purpose of the *Access to Information Act* is to provide the public a right of access to information to records under the control of a government institution, that necessary exceptions to the right of access should be limited and specific and that decisions on the disclosure of government information should be reviewed independently of government.

The Annual Report is prepared for and tabled in Parliament in accordance with Section 94 of the *Access to Information Act*.

The mandate of the VFPA is to comply with the *Access to Information Act*, the principles of open government from which it is derived and for making any required decisions.

Vancouver Fraser Port Authority ATIP Office Organization Structure

The Access to Information & Privacy Coordinator reports to the Head of the Institution who is the President and Chief Executive Officer. Written, email or ATIP Online Request Service access requests are directed to the Information & Privacy Coordinator, who opens a file and coordinates the duties imposed by the legislation. The Information & Privacy Coordinator maintains the ATIP filling system to account for all deliberations and decisions taken concerning each request. The Information & Privacy Coordinator liases with the Office of the Information Commissioner regarding complaints and investigations.

Statistics & Interpretation of Statistics

The VFPA received 39 requests during the reporting period April 1, 2019 to March 31, 2020. There was one outstanding request from the previous reporting period. Four of the requests for the current reporting period have been carried over to the next reporting period.

The requests received and completed during the reporting period originated from three of the six source categories: Academia, Business (Private Sector) and Public.

Attached is the Form TBS/SCT 350-62 "*Statistical Report on the Access to Information Act*", which provides statistical data on formal access requests received by the VFPA.

Of the 36 requests that were completed during the reporting period, eight were disclosed in full, 15 were disclosed in part, three were all exempted, four had "no records exist" responses, one was transferred, four were abandoned and one was neither confirmed nor denied. There was one exemption invoked based on subsections

13(1)(b), 16(2)(c) and 20(1)(c), two exemptions invoked based on subsections 20(1)(d), and 21(1)(d), three exemptions invoked based on subsection 21(1)(a), four exemptions invoked based on subsection 18(b), five exemptions invoked based on subsections 18(a) and 23, six exemptions invoked based on subsection 19(1) and twelve exemptions invoked based on subsection 20(1)(b) of the *Act*.
